

Thank you to everyone who supports our appeal and please keep saving your coppers etc.



35th Hartlepool (St George's) Scout Group

The Beavers are currently working on their Space Explorers badge. They made paper rockets and then took part in a game where the rockets took off and orbited the moon. They will also be learning about the planets and taking part in other space related activities.

The Cubs are working on their Astronomy badge. They discussed solar and lunar eclipse and the orbits of the different planets. They hope to visit Wynyard Planetarium and Observatory in February, possibly accompanied by the Beavers. Some of the cubs remembered seeing the moon rising when they were at camp in North Yorkshire last year, as the sky was clear and there was no light pollution.

The Scouts are working towards their Local Knowledge badge. They have looked at a street map of Hartlepool and worked out how to reach different places in town, such as the railway station to find out the time of a train from the timetable and the cinema to find out the time of a film. Hands Up For Hartlepool

At Hartlepool Foodbank we provide over 15,000 emergency meals each year and these are a lifeline to people in crisis. However we recognise that these cannot lift people out of poverty or help them to change their lives for the long term. **Hands Up For Hartle-pool** is a new project designed to complement our emergency food provision to vulnerable people in the town through information, advice and guidance for Foodbank users and the wider community. We hope to be able to offer support on topics as varied as debt, health, money management and housing.

We plan to hold a session each Wednesday in our new unit in the Middleton Grange, inviting our network of expert agencies to attend and support people on a drop in basis. In future we hope the space will also become somewhere for us to hold seasonal events like school uniform banks. We are incredibly lucky to have such a large network of support organisations in the town and we hope the project will provide a central hub for them to access those who need them most.

We are currently looking for volunteers to help support the project. Volunteering would be on a Wednesday (either weekly, fortnightly or monthly from February if possible) and full training will be given. A variety of roles will be available from providing advice and support to administration to making teas and coffees for visitors.

We are holding an open day on **Wednesday 5th February** to explain more about the project. If you or anyone you know would be interested in volunteering or finding out more about the project please feel free to pop in anytime between **10am - 2pm**. We are on the upper level of the Middleton Grange shopping centre, next door to The Galleries Cafe.

Safe Water in Matabeleland

This month we highlight the superb work done by one of *Commitment for Life's* Christain Aid partners in babwe, Dabane Trust.

Dabane Trust operates in the south- western areas of the country - Matabeleland South and Matabeleland North. These regions are classified as arid and semi- arid rangelands. Here, Dabane Trust develops supports sustainable low technology community initiatives. It is a leading, non-governmental organization cated to establishing water and food secure communities.

Dabane has what they call 'Water Workshops' which involve teaching and learning about water. Was sanitation and hygiene are especially emphasised.

Communities are encouraged to have clean kitchens, pit latrines with handwashing facilities and and well organised refuse pits. Communities are also encouraged to draw water for domestic purposes of oses only from approved water sources. In addition, Dabane is involved in borehole rehabilitation and nand and construction of Rowa pumps.

Dabane works with rural communities to develop clean, palatable water supplies for household use stock drinking and small-scale irrigation system. Communities are assisted in developing alternative and sonal water resources for sustainable domestic use, sanitation and hygiene. Learn more at http://dabane dabane-org

Could you be a trustee?

Schools and churches (PCCs) are not the only organizations that need to recruit governors. There are opportunities to serve God by becoming a trustee of a registered charity. Specifically, the foodbank has vacancies that we would very much like to fill. Here are some questions and answers about this:

- Q. what sort of people are we looking for?
- A. People very much like you people with a heart to serve God by helping people_who are finding life difficult at the moment. Maybe you already do voluntary work, but would like an opportunity to contribute on a more strategic level.
- Q. Are there any specific skills that you need?
- A. Obviously you need to be articulate and able to see the "bigger picture" than just the person in front of you at the moment. As is the case for school governors, people can contribute with a wide range of skills and experience that complement and build on what other trustees bring. At the moment we would be especially interested in somebody well acquainted with social media. Someone with experience in administration, secretarial work, or management would also be very welcome. However if you don't tick those boxes that doesn't mean you should not consider applying. Let us know what you are able to bring and help us decide with you whether God has a role for you in this work.
- Q. Don't trustees have some statutory responsibilities?
- A. Yes they do, but the legal stuff is shared and the Board has corporate responsibilities, not individual trustees.
- Q. I already have a day job. How would it work around that?
- A. Meetings are held in the evening. If you were not available during the day you wouldn't be able to get involved with the day-to-day operation of the foodbank, but then that's not what trustees are really for. The Board of Trustees deals with strategic direction and manages the foodbank through our paid employees, who report to the Board.
- Q. I'm already very heavily committed to other things. How much time will it take?
- A. Attending about 4 meetings/year and the AGM. That's the minimum. Of course to be effective, we would expect a trustee to take an interest in the work of the foodbank, in our employees and volunteers, supporting them in particular ways. You could become the Secretary, or Communications link or Health & Safety representative on the Board that would take more time but this is not required. Maybe there's something else you need to give up in order to enable you to take on a new role, supporting God's work outside of the church.
- Q. I'm interested but not ready to commit yet. Where can I find out more information?
- A. Why not have an informal conversation with one of the existing trustees: Rev'd Clive Hall (278504), Rev'd Andrew Craig (422461) or Mrs Susan Atkinson (428558)?
- Q. How do I apply?




