

Dear Friends

The news this week has, at last, got some respite from the usual bad news of wars and scandals, and all due to our very British interest in the monarchy. Not only us- I suspect at times the Americans wish they had a real monarchy instead of "celebrities".

I'm referring, of course to the Jubilee. It's hard to imagine a life without the Queen. One of my first memories is of being told by my dad that the king was dead and, of course, I remember the coronation being on my aunty's television.

But a Platinum Jubilee! Who could have imagined that? I can't imagine the Queen did as she made her oaths at the coronation, but there can be no doubt that she meant them, still does and relies on God's help. And I find it wonderful that what she has asked for is trees- The Queen's Green Canopy.

The concept of a jubilee began in biblical times when God instructed Moses that every 50th year was to be a time of celebration, rejoicing and rest – rest for the land and rest for the people. The designating of a Jubilee is not just for allowing the land to rest. It is a reminder that God has created everything. It is also a reminder that humans are not the only owners of the land and are not to hold onto property forever.

We failed with the Jubilee Debt Campaign, though at least some countries were released from the stranglehold of debt. Now we need to concentrate on the Earth. I took part in the Big Plastic Count. The results were staggering. We used 71 bits of plastic. At the same rate, in a year the UK would use 103,745,200,000 bits.

On our results 13% is recycled in the UK, 19% is exported, 24% is landfill and 44% is incinerated. And how much makes it's way into the sea and into the food chain? This only refers to the rubbish which is disposed of responsibly.

Not good enough! And that's only the problem of plastic.

We are stewards of the earth. At Pentecost the Holy Spirit cam to be a helper. Some branches of Christianity equate this with Holy Wisdom. This Jubilee and Pentecost, this is what we need.

For the Queen's jubilee- and God's, let's pledge to do what we can to let the earth rest and recover. Make it a place fit for a queen – and the King.

Dave Bainbridge and Sally Minnear concert on Saturday 18th June 2022

Dave Bainbridge is one of the finest guitarists in the world! Quite a big claim but Dave is certainly up there with the best. He was born in Darlington and studied music at the music college in Leeds. There he learned piano and won a BBC Award for the most talented Jazz keyboard player. He formed the Celtic Christian band Iona with his friends Joanna Hogg and Dave Fitzgerald and they went on to release 12 albums to huge acclaim.

By now, Dave had established himself as not only an excellent keyboard player but also as an immensely talented guitarist and music producer. He formed his own production company in his Lincolnshire home and is now in great demand worldwide for his production and musical skills and talents.

After Iona went their separate ways due to other commitments, Dave released a solo album and a number of collaborations with other artists. A notable release was Eye of the Eagle featuring the words of David Adam from the Lindisfarne community. Dave released his 2nd solo album with his band Celestial Fire in 2014. This was highly praised and featured the vocal skills of his friend Sally Minnear.

Since then Dave has continued to work hard and is now the keyboard player with The Strawbs, known widely for their track 'Part of the Union' but not really representative of the band's musical output. In the Strawbs, Dave replaced their long time keyboard player Rick Walkeman. Large shoes to fill.

More recently Dave was asked to join Lifesigns with John Young. Lifesigns recorded an album during lockdown in 2020/21 that was individually recorded then put together afterwards by Dave in his home studio. The resulting album Altitude topped the rock album charts for 9 weeks in 2021.

In early May 2022, Lifesigns with Dave Bainbridge played to over 5000 people on 'Cruise to the Edge', a music cruise in the Caribbean. It was accepted by many critics and fans who attended the event that Lifesigns were the standout group on the cruise. Praise indeed when the names of the other artists on board are seen.

Sally Minnear, daughter of Kerry Minnear from Gentle Giant fame, studied music and was chosen by Michael Flatley as vocalist for his Lord of the Dance show. Sally is an accomplished multi-instrumentalist and has a very beautiful voice.

From Northern Synod

It's time to celebrate!

We are all aware that this year marks the 70th year since our current Queen ascended to the throne – celebrations for the Platinum Jubilee are almost upon us and it promises to be a great reminder of the good things that have been achieved during her reign.

But two other groups of people are celebrating a Golden Jubilee this year. The United Reformed Church is celebrating 50 years of existence and there will be National Services of Celebration. Beamish Museum is also celebrating its Golden Jubilee – from small beginnings it continues to grow and is one of the regions premier attractions.

It seems appropriate then, that here in the Northern Synod, we are choosing to celebrate the URC 50 years with a day at Beamish. The event is free to all those connected with the URC Northern Synod but it is essential to book tickets in advance.

This is an event for all ages – not just for children, young people and families. Please check if the booking is being made centrally by someone in your own church and if that is the case, there is no need to book again.

Entry to the museum will be between 10 am and midday and you can enjoy the attractions of the museum. There will be an exclusive URC marquee on the events field where you can collect a basic picnic lunch from midday. Drinks and a range of prayer stations and activities will be available throughout the day – you can come and meet up with each other during the day. At 3pm we will gather to celebrate together with a time of worship and thanks to God and of course, cake and tea

The event is designed to be accessible to all. Beamish is well set up to support those with limited mobility. The service will be appropriate for everyone that the URC connects with including user groups from churches.

The event is being paid for by the Synod so all you need to do is to find a way to get to Beamish. Why not consider hiring a coach or a minibus? If finance is an issue get in touch to see if we can help you with that.
