

Dear friends,

May I start with two thankyous. Firstly for the invitation to contribute to the newsletter and second, on behalf of the Grange Road members, for the warm welcome we have received since joining you for worship from the start of August. Whilst, if planning the date by anything other than when the sale of Grange Road completed, we might not have chosen August as the time to move for me at least it proved good timing – for in ministry September, as with my previous career is teaching, is always a busy time.

At the end of a day, when I want to unwind, one of my 'go to' things is to play a few games on my tablet. Currently that's likely to be Farm Heroes or Royal Match. For those who've never come across them (and why would you), both basically involve matching objects in certain combinations to collect required items before running out of moves.

Whilst supposedly being used to unwind I find at times that even simple games have taught me interesting lessons. One is that in both cases the more you have the easier it is to gain more. When you successfully complete a level, you gain bonus points or collect items (I'll call them aides) which help you complete future levels. So if I win 10 levels without needing to use those aides I can go on and win many more on subsequent days. However, if I'm out of aides I can be stuck on a level for weeks. That's where the temptation comes – which I make myself resist – to purchase aides. I play the free version! That relates so clearly to everyday life. If you have plenty of money you can make more money or make savings by buying in bulk, whilst those who have very little have to pay more. Not just with food but things like pre-payment utility meters which cost far more than if paying by direct debit.

Another reflection is that all too often, when I'm stuck on a level, I keep trying the same method, time after time. Yet when I realise and try a different start, I can often compete the level with no difficulty. (Think about playing noughts and crosses, do you always start in the same square? Similarly, if you play chess. What happens if you change tactics? It's a similar thing). Dare I suggest that, as a church, we can fall into that same trap. We keep doing what we've always done, whether it is working or not. For both congregations we currently have the perfect opportunity to reflect on what we do and why we do it. For example, the URC take communion out to the congregation, Methodists tend to come forward and receive at the front – have you ever considered why? A URC minister once explained their reasons to me and I gave my understanding. Both are valid. So if you notice differences between traditions ask, lets find out more about the background to the way we worship, lets dare to try different things from time to time whether form our own traditions or new to all. Who knows, we may find ourselves clearing barriers we once though insurmountable or we may discover the reasons behind 'what we've always done'.

Now where is my tablet? Time for a short breather before I start on the Circuit newsletter!

in Zimbabwe.

Batsirai Byanutete, lives in the Mutoko District in Zimbabwe. He is a young man who has had his life turned around by the intervention of our Christian Aid partner. Christian Aid has assisted with the help of indigenous knowledge, doing brilliant work in identifying indigenous plants and shrubs that can be carefully combined into livestock feed. These bushes and plants are processed using a Christian Aid supplied milling machine. The product is then bagged and stored, ready for sale.

This highly nutritious supplement is given to animals in lean times (like now) and just before market. The animals are healthier, which means that the community is healthier too.

Your support for Commitment for Life, means that Batsirai Byamutete, instead of hanging out with directionless youths, drinking and getting into mischief, has a sense of purpose now that his milling expertise is much valued by the community.

"Drew - Andrew Mills to honour his full name here - was for more than five years the reliable anchor of co-ordination and management around whom HTP's volunteer patrols at night time economy functioned. Drew was an active participant as well as a behind-the-scenes administrator to ensure the

voluntary effort of staffing weekend patrols and providing the support needed to make the service run smoothly and regularly. When family duties made it necessary for him to retire from the front-line, he willingly joined the team of trustees to oversee the Christian- based policies and practice which help to see members of the public home safely after a night out in town.

"Drew is much missed. The donation of your church members and others ensures that his conscientious pioneering work is able to continue and therefore his memorial ensured. Do please pass on

the gratitude of HTP's present trustees, Drew's colleagues and friends, and our new volunteer recruits to all those at Grange Road Methodist Church and its visitors and thank them for both the tribute and the material help they have provided in support of our work."

General information

The church/venue itself has been busy over the past few months and we are excited to say that we have had some major restoration work undertaken on our 124 year old Binns organ. The main bellows have been restored and the organ is once again in full voice. The difference is astonishing I am sure you all agree.

The Grange Road Methodist Church small grand piano has been moved into the east transept and this will be played by Catch the Sparrow during our Remembrance concert.

We have also removed the choir pews in front of the organ. At present we are rebuilding the staging in this area and have replaced the 3 rows of pews with 2 rows of chairs. This enables us to have music stands in front of each chair thereby giving us much more space for orchestral players in the future. In May 2024 we are hosting the Teesside Symphony Orchestra (TSO) so this area will be well used for that concert. The central section is also perfect for percussionists. This will be used during Carols for Hartlepool by the Hartlepool Brass Band.

Attached are a couple of posters giving further details about the concerts and events running up to the end of the year.

Door tickets will be able to be purchased cashless for the first time on the 11th October.

Please make sure you get your tickets for the events early as this supports the venue and also saves you money.
